Last Sunday saw our last races for the 2011 winter season and it was a chance for our walkers to test themselves out over some long distances. Unfortunately competitors and officials were met with cold and windy conditions with steady drizzly rain - not exactly conducive to good walking. Luckily it cleared mid morning but it remained cold and windy.

The main events on offer were the Victorian 50km for men and the VRWC/RacewalkingAustralia 50km championship for women. Of the four starters, we had 3 finishers and some performances that are definitely worthy of recording. **Simon Evans** was the sole competitor in the Victorian men's 50km championship and he was up to the task in his first ever attempt, finishing in 5:38:06. This followed his win in the Victorian 30km championship last month and his bronze medals in the Victorian 10km and 15km championships earlier in the season. **Michelle Thompson**, better known as our top ultra distance walker, was the winner of the inaugural Racewalking Australia 50km championship, recording a magnificent 5:13:14, a time some 10 minutes better than any other Australian women has done. More of that later. She and Simon walked together for the first half but then she powered away as he slowed in the second half. **Liz Feldman** and **Heather Carr** were the other two women attempting the 50km championship and both were chasing W60 records. Heather was ahead at the 30km mark and she was rewarded with a new **Australian Masters W60 30km record of 3:19:01**. But she was listing badly to one side, a condition which got worse as the race progressed. Alas, it was so worrying to the officials that at the 45km mark, we had to withdraw her from the race, a decision about which she was understandably very disappointed. This opened the door for Liz who was still moving very well and she rose to the challenge, completing her 50km with a new **World Masters W60 50km record of 6:05:43**.

We also contested our annual 35km Club Championship for the Ray Smith Trophy and AIS based club member **Chris Erickson** dominated, winning by just over 40 minutes with a superb time of 2:37:36. Chris was keen to test his 50km pace with a timetrial over this slightly shorter distance and all went according to plan as he ticked off 4:30 kilometres with monotonous regularity before kicking down with a final 5km split of 21:46. Behind him, Andrew Jamieson powered through the first 30km to take some 12 minutes off the **World Masters M65 30km record with a time of 2:39:25**. He then strolled through a slow last 5km to satisfy the requirements and finish the event. Third place went to Michelle Thompson en route to her 50km win. Overall, it was great to see 8 finishers in such a long event.

Last weekend Dane Bird-Smith, our Australian Junior racewalk record holder, competed as part of the Australian Junior team at the World Mountain Running Championships in Tirane in Albania and he produced the goods. The Australian Mountain Running website (<http://www.mountainrunning.coolrunning.com.au>) reported the on junior races as follows:

Running in 32 degree heat on Sunday, the Australian Junior Women's team finished 4th with Rosie Donegan 6th, Annabelle Wilson 10th and Bronwyn Humphries 20th. The Junior Men's team was also outstanding, finishing 6th, with **Dane Bird-Smith 15th**, Jordan Nelson 27th after a fall at the start, Ben Duffus 37th and Charlie Brooks 50th.

I also picked up a short note from Dane's facebook where he comments

15th at world mountain champs Albania. Hardest Course I have ever seen, 40% inclines and even worse declines. more than 3/4 of the fields stacked hardcore. Dozen DNF carried off the course. Just a dangerous course in general, but so much fun.
