I have recently mentioned the wonderful performances of late by 56 year old Italian walker Graziano Morotti (see Heel and Toe magazine 2007, numbers 14 and 18). While Andrew Jamieson has been busy setting new M60 World records, his own M55 records are being rewritten by Morotti (born 15/1/51). Graziano's new marks include

- M55 20 km record on 1 April 2006 in 1.33.38 in Lugano
- M55 30 km record on 8 October 2006 in 2.29.34 in Maranello
- M55 50 km record on 13 February 2007 in 4:23:34 in Livorno

I was able to meet Graziano in Dudince when he was competing in the 50 km event there on 24 March 2007 and found out a fair bit more about this wonderful Masters walker. For starters, he has been walking since 1974 and his PBs show that, at his peak, he was an international standard walker. His times would have guaranteed him Olympic representation in most countries at that time but he was unfortunate to be racing in Italy against semi-professional walkers who were mostly in the Italian Armed Forces. So his chances were few and far between.

He has maintained his times very well over the years. Take for example his best 10 km time for each year. This is an almost continuous racing record except for a small period around 1990 when he briefly retired from the sport.
