### **UK TRAINING AND COACHING BOOKS**



There have been three official racewalking training books published in England over the years, each called "Race Walking" and each targeting the racewalking audience of the period (see cover images opposite and below).

In 1957, the Amateur Athletics Union (A.A.A.) in London published its first official coaching handbook for race walking. It was written by 1936 Olympic 50km champion **Harold** Whitlock and ran to 62 pages, focusing mainly on technique and training.


In 1976, the British Amateur Athletic Board (B.A.A.B.) published a revamp of the book, **Race Walking**, written this time by National Event Coach **Julian Hopkins**. This edition was a complete reworking of Whitlock's book and added sample training and racing programs, season planning, nutrition, injury management and much more.

In 1989, the B.A.A.B. published a further revamp of the basic training manual, this time written by the then event coach **Peter Markham**.




I am lucky enough to have all 3 books. Which is the best? In my opinion, the second one (1976) gets my tick of approval as the most comprehensive, and it still reads very well 45 years later. I have scanned and uploaded it for general review. Check it out at the link below:

(Editor's note: I also have a copy of the Julian Hopkins book, much read and thumb-stained since I got it in the 70s. I recommend following the link Tim provided and perusing it, as much of the training advice is still useful. Fundamentals are fundamental, after all.

Something to consider is that, when Hopkins wrote the book, women's race walking had yet to appear on the international stage and there was no representation for female walkers in major championships or on world record lists. Hence, Margareta Simu of Sweden is shown as being the holder of several 'best performances' only.)

### \*\* Turkey's new U18 national record for 5.000m indoor walk

Boxing Day may not be a 'thing' in Turkey, but that doesn't mean their walkers won't come out swinging. Thanks to Nicola Maggio for the following report:

Istanbul (TUR), 26 December - The indoor season in Turkey has started in Istanbul.

Yesterday, Saturday 25 December, a 5,000m indoor walking competition (with timing also on 3000m indoor) for U18 boys and 3.000m indoor for U18 girls, took place in the Salon Rekor Deneme Yarismalari.

#### 5.000m indoor walk U18 boys

The new names are those of the twin brothers Diyar and Ozan Bayram born on Sep. 18, 2004.

The victory went to Diyar Bayram (TUR) in 20:50.95.

With this performance, the young Turkish athlete set Turkey's new national record for indoor U18s. The previous record (21:14:85) belonged to Mustafa Tekdal (TUR) who had also set it in Istanbul on 13.1.2019. Diyar Bayram also achieved the new national record in the indoor **3.000m** pass with a time of **12:17.42**.
